Distinguished Teaching Professorships: Faculty with the rank of Senior Instructor II and Senior Lecturer II can apply for this provost program that <u>recognizes the extraordinary contributions</u> of teaching career faculty and provides opportunities to amplify their expertise through leadership and teaching projects.

Applications are due March 1.

UO Sustainability Awards: Faculty are invited to consider nominating yourself or someone else for a UO Sustainability Award. This award recognizes excellence in sustainability throughout the University of Oregon from teaching and research to student leadership, student programming, and campus operations and administration, and more.
