Biology Department Assessment Plan 2017-2018

Last year the Biology Department engaged with institutional data around course completion and graduation rates, and directly assessed upper-level student learning outcomes in the area of molecular biology (2016-2017). At the annual Biology Department retreat (09/2017) there was call for directly assessing more general biology learning outcomes and doing so in a pre- post- design. A peer-reviewed, reliable and valid general biology assessment instrument is expected to be published shortly, allowing us to administer this instrument the 2018-2019 academic year. This instrument is directly aligned to our department's learning outcomes through the Vision and Change document that provides a nationally shared vision for undergraduate biology education (AAAS, 2011). To prepare for the implementation of this new instrument in 2018-2019, and to ensure that the collection, analysis and reporting of department assessment efforts is meaningful and useful in an ongoing manner, the 2017-2018 year will be used for assessment planning and coordination. We will undertake the following activities:

- 1. We will form an assessment committee with both career non-tenure track and tenure-track faculty.
- 2. The assessment committee will propose a plan for collecting, analyzing and reporting assessment data in a useful and ongoing way. This plan will be put before all the biology faculty for feedback and revision.
- 3. We will host a visit from a PULSE ambassador (http://www.pulse-community.org/) to guide department conversations about the alignment of our curriculum and assessment with Vision and Change (AAAS, 2011).
- 4. Subject to the revised assessment plan, in Fall 2018 instructors in both the honors and general biology sequence will plan to administer the forthcoming general biology assessment as a pre-test.
