The University of Oregon is located on Kalapuya Ilihi, the traditional indigenous homeland of the Kalapuya people. Following treaties between 1851 and 1855, Kalapuya people were dispossessed of their indigenous homeland by the United States government and forcibly removed to the Coast Reservation in Western Oregon. Today, descendants are citizens of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon and the Confederated Tribes of the Siletz Indians of Oregon, and continue to make important contributions in their communities, at UO, and across the land we now refer to as Oregon.

RESEARCH

INVESTING IN FACULTY RESEARCH, SCHOLARSHIP, AND CREATIVE WORK

The Office of the Vice President for Research and Innovation (OVPRI) supports and advances high-impact research, scholarship, and creative activity through various internal funding programs. With an annual investment of more than \$1 million, OVPRI facilitates new interdisciplinary engagement, preliminary data and feasibility studies, and provides time and support for the development of new artistic projects and scholarly works. Through Research Development Services, funding is available to enhance the competitiveness of proposals through external review and visualization services.

OVPRI RESEARCH SEED GRANT

These grants support faculty in acquiring preliminary data and developing a competitive proposal for significant external funding.

FACULTY RESEARCH AWARDS

This award provides funds for scholarship, creative projects, and research for eligible faculty across the UO.

UO FOUNDATION TRUSTEE EXCELLENCE GRANT

This grant aims to advance exceptional research, scholarship, or creative work by faculty in ways that translate to significant impact—be those contributions to their field of scholarship, the discovery of new knowledge, and/or meaningful connections and partnerships with communities.

KNIGHT CAMPUS

The Phil and Penny Knight Campus for Accelerating Scientific Impact is an ambitious initiative where teams of UO bioengineers and bioscientists provide innovative approaches that establishes Oregon as a center for both research and development, <u>making</u> <u>Oregon a place where companies</u> <u>can start-up, grow, and stay</u>.

This fund is designed to provide the support and capacity to position research teams for success in securing a major, center-scale grant opportunity or a series of investments (federal, state, philanthropic) in a strategic research area.

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT

The Office of the Provost works to ensure faculty members feel supported by the university, find their community, and are able to continually grow across their careers as teachers, mentors, scholars, and leaders. Programs, workshops, and trainings are offered for faculty and unit heads, with special attention to moments of transition.

The university also supports faculty in building a network of mentors. Additionally, we provide support for them to develop their own skills as responsive, reciprocal, and adaptive mentors, coaches, or advisers of students and junior level faculty.

TEACHING

UO instructors are supported by the Teaching Engagement Program (TEP)-a unit committed to enriching the university's vibrant teaching culture by supporting inclusive, engaged, and research-informed practice. Teaching excellence is part of what makes UO distinctive as a university. TEP offers a wide range of resources, learning opportunities, and services to support faculty and graduate student instructors.

Each year, UO faculty are awarded Distinguished Teaching Awards, Distinguished Teaching Professorships, Williams Fellowships and Instructional Grants, and other significant teaching awards.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Research Development Services, part of the Office of the Vice President for Research and Innovation (OVPRI), supports faculty members to increase externally funded research activities.

Its services are designed to meet the unique needs of faculty across discipline and career stages. The office helps researchers identify funding opportunities and develop long-term strategies for applying for external funding. They also help faculty develop compelling, competitive proposals by reviewing grant narratives and application materials. OVPRI also provides project management assistance to aid faculty in navigating complex submissions.

COMMUNITY AND BELONGING

Community and socialization play a crucial role in generating satisfaction, happiness, and promoting physical and mental well-being. They also stimulate creativity, energy, and enthusiasm. The Office of the Provost and UO's Division of Equity and Inclusion work together to create an inclusive, collaborative, and engaged community at the University of Oregon. They provide both formal and informal opportunities for faculty members to socialize and receive support for their intellectual, personal, and career development.

CAREER READINESS AND STUDENT SUPPORT

NATIVE STRATEGIES GROUP

This work includes the Home Flight Scholars Program, launched in 2023.
